Type of Position

Timeframe: This is a full time fourth grade position for the 2022-2023 school year.

Requirements:

- A current Ohio Department of Education teaching license, or a current teaching license that may be transferred to Ohio.
- Work with administration and colleagues to maintain a classroom that reflects the rigor and excellence of ODCS instruction.
- Available to begin planning and preparing prior to the first day of school, which is Aug. 24, 2022.
- Provide high quality instruction on campus five days per week.
- Integration of Christian worldview and biblical worldview principles throughout curriculum and activities.
- Knowledge and proficiency in the use of Google Classroom.
- Collaboration with administration and other ODCS teachers, to ensure students are meeting Ohio standards in core content areas (ELA, Math, Social Studies and Science). Bible is also a core content area of instruction at ODCS.
